

Sonic Signals and GOD-POCKET Exhibition Access Guide

There are currently two exhibitions open at Eastside Projects.

Sonic Signals is in the main gallery - you walk straight into this space when you enter the building.

GOD-POCKET is in the second gallery - the door to this space is at the far end of the right hand wall of the gallery up a short corridor.

Both exhibitions are wheelchair accessible. Chairs are available in both spaces if you need to rest.

Guide dogs are welcome in the gallery. If you are visually impaired please talk to a member of staff who will be happy to guide you through the work. They can also offer an audio description.

Large format and audio versions of written material are available on the front desk.

What can you expect?

Sonic Signals

- **Sonic Signals** consists of a series of audio recordings made by primary school aged children which are being played out loud in the gallery on four speakers. The sound fills the space. Some of the recordings are loud and contain unexpected noises, they are on a randomised loop so staff cannot tell what is coming next. They include talking, shouting and screaming.

- There are some large bean bags to sit on to listen to the audio. They can be a little bit difficult to get out of. If you would rather use a chair there are black folding chairs available.

GOD-POCKET

- There is low lighting in this exhibition. The room is lit with one spotlight and UV lights. The door will close after you walk in. Please take care and allow your eyes to adjust. If it is too dark please just speak to the member of staff on the front desk and they will turn additional lights on.
- In the space is a large structure with a roof covered in mosquito netting. The structure and the murals painted on the walls behind it will be glowing in the UV light.
- On a table in the centre of the structure is a tablet which is playing a video with subtitles. A member of staff can audio describe the video - please just speak to the person on the front desk.
- An audio recording of a guided meditation may be playing in the space.
