

Exhibition Access Document
Harun Morrison: Experiments with Everyday Objects
19 May - 31 July 2021

The exhibition is in the main gallery at Eastside Projects - you walk straight into this gallery when you enter the building.

Up to a maximum of fifteen visitors can be in the gallery at one time. If we are full you may have to wait, unless you have booked in advance.

The exhibition is wheelchair accessible, and alternative formats of written and audio material are available. Guide dogs are welcome.

What is in the exhibition?

- There are video and sound works in the exhibition. They play simultaneously so you will be able to hear overlapping sounds.
- When you walk through the door into Eastside Projects you will see a large television screen hanging from a shiny pole in front of you which will have a film with sound playing on it.
- To your left there is a dartboard. On the floor 230cm from the wall there is a raised blue bar attached to the floor. This is an oche (toe line) for the dart board. You are welcome to have a game! Please sanitise your hands before and after you use the darts.
- There is a wooden sculpture in the form of stairs in the middle of the room.
- To the back of the gallery there are glasses filled with red wine on a wooden shelf - this has a potent smell. There is a dome shaped speaker hanging above this area, the sound will be louder underneath this spot.
- Flashing blue lights will briefly emit from the TV which is sitting on the floor, leaning against the wall in front of the grey curtain.
